Darshan School of Music, Palakkad (Recognized by Kerala Sangeetha Nataka Akademy) is run by Darshan Educational and Charitable trust which is a registered Charitable trust vide No.72/02 in Kerala. The school has long 25 years of teaching tradition both in Indian and Western Music. From the very beginning the school has adopted a syllabus of its own which imparts a new methodology in music study with equal importance to practical and theory. The syllabus lays a strong foundation in music for those who pursue it. Students are admitted in the school irrespective of their age. Other than the traditional classes, our institution undertake the courses and examinations of the institutions outside Kerala. Thus the institution conducted the courses on Karnatic Music of Akhil Bharathiya Gandharva Maha Vidyalaya Mandal, Mumbai for four consecutive years from 2005 to 2009 and the students were issued certificates which helped many of them get a job in this field. Presently, the institution, DARSHAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC, PALAKKAD is the (Master Franchisee) Programme Co-ordinating centre of BSS Cultural Mission in Kerala and oversees. The institution has acquired this prestigious grade by submitting a memorandum to the authorities of Bharath Sevak Samaj (A National Development Agency Promoted by Planning Commission, Government of India) pointing out the necessity of the courses in Music, Dance and Arts for those who have aptitude in these subjects but not in a position to study through main stream or those who had to stop their study in half way, and getting the approval of BSS for commencing and co-ordinating the courses in Kerala and oversees which can be a catalyst for the studies of Music, Dance and Art in these regions. They can start or continue their study informally and can achieve a Diploma certificate of BSS Cultural Mission approved by Government of India, which make them eligible for higher study as well as get a job in the respective fields both in India and abroad. Those who completed 10 years can join the course. The main advantage of these courses is that a student can simultaneously continue his/her formal academic education and attend the courses of BSS Cultural Mission. The courses are structured with a syllabus of hierarchy, which is formulated by consulting the experts in the respective fields, and study materials.

As a part of our mission to promote the art education and performance, Darshan School of Music regularly organise programme for the upcoming talent and honour the 'Gurus' by giving the title *NADACHANDRIKA* with the co-operation of "Swathi Sangeetha Sabha"-Palakkad.



ABOUT THE COURSE

The course aims at the promotion of "Informal Education" in the fields of Music, Dance & Arts and to bring them to the common man. The syllabus and the curriculum are designed in such a way that the student can join the course at the age of 10 and progress slowly in the subject he/she has chosen and can gain the knowledge of a BA student by the time he/she attains 20 years of age.

The salient features of the courses are:-

- 1. One can pursue Music, Dance & Arts study along with his/her academic Studies.
- 2. Any one can join the course at the tender age of 10 years and there is no upper age limit set.
- 3. Equal importance is given to theory and practical in the syllabus.
- 4. The syllabus is designed in such a way that one can reap the benefits of Gurukula Vidyabhyasa from a class room level training.
- 5. There will be a uniform syllabus for all the students whether he/she is studying in institutions recognized for the purpose or he/she is studying through home tuition.
- 6. One can write the examination in Malayalam/English.
- 7. One can join the course informally and get a diploma certificate from Bharath Sevak Samaj, the national development agency promoted by the Government of India.

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General Instructions to the candidates

- 1. The candidate shall read the prospectus carefully before filling in the application and preserve the prospectus till the completion of the course.
- 2. A Student can apply for examination only through recognized Study Centres of Bharath Sevak Samaj (BSS Cultural Mission), but can study privately.
- 3. Students who are studying in the recognized Study Centres of BSS Cultural Mission are considered as affiliated candidates, and students who are not studying in the recognized Study Centres of BSS Cultural Mission are considered as non-affiliated candidates.
- 4. Non-affiliated students can also appear for examination subject to the payment of an additional amount of Rs. 4,000/- (Indian money /Rupees) for each examination.
- 5. Applications must be complete in all respects. Student should mention their mobile no: (WhatsApp no:) & E-mail ID in the application forms.(Admission, Registration & Examination) Latest (six month) passport size photographs in the place provided in the application forms. Student should ensure that signature of Centre-in-charge and seal of the Study Centre is affixed in all correspondences. No application will be accepted without the seal of the Study Centre or incomplete in any respect.
- 6. BSS Cultural Mission Programme Co-ordinating Centre (Master Franchisee) Darshan School of Music Palakkad, will not be liable for any postal delay or loss in transit of any document.
- 7. Application form, Prospectus and Syllabus can be obtained by post, or in person or from recognized Study Centers of Bharath Sevak Samaj (BSS Cultural Mission) and Darshan School of Music, Harishankar Road, Tharekkad, Palakkad District, Pin- 678001, Kerala, India. E-mail:-informalmusicstudy@gmail.com.
- 8. Original certificates, if any, need not be sent along with the application.
- 9. All communication will be sent to the address provided by the candidate in the application form. Any change in the address should be intimated to the Controller of Examinations or Programme Co-ordinator.
- 10. Enrolment numbers will be allotted to the students at the time of issue of hall ticket. Student should mention this number for further correspondence.
- 11. Identity card with photo will be issued to the students. Which will be valid till the end of the course. Students should bring the identity card while appearing for the examination.
- 12. Hall tickets will be issued to the students only after remittance of examination / course fee without which he/she won't be admitted to the examination hall.
- 13. The student will get detailed syllabus only after registration with the remittance of course fee in full amount. Study materials will be available on additional payment. Details of payments to the BSS Cultural Mission regarding fee, study materials etc. will be given in the annexure (chart) of respective academic year.

Guidelines regarding examination



- 1. For Karnatic Music -(Vocal & Instruments) Swarapoorna-I, Gaanapoorna-I and Raagapoorna-I there will be only internal examination and only marklist will be issued. For Swarapoorna-II, Gaanapoorna-II and Ragaapoorna-II there will be public examination and Mark list will be issued. BSS Diploma Course Certificate will be issued only after passing the Public examination.
- 2. For Dance Course: Naatyapoorna Lower -Level-I, Naatyapoorna Higher Level-I and Naatyapoorna Advanced Level -I there will be only internal examination and only marklist will be issued. For Naatyapoorna Lower Level -II, Naatyapoorna Higher Level -II and Naatyapoorna Advanced Level -II there will be public examination and Mark list will be issued. BSS Diploma Course Certificate will be issued only after passing the Public Examination.
- 3. For Art Course: Chithrapoorna: Lower Level -I, Higher Level -I and Advanced Level -I there will be only internal examination and only marklist will be issued. For Chithrapoorna Lower Level -II, Higher and Advanced Level -II there will be public examination and Mark list will be issued. BSS Diploma Course Certificate will be issued only after passing the Public examination.
- 4. The minimum age for attending the various examinations will be as per the table shown below. Completed ages will be reckoned as on 31st March of the year in which he/she is attending the examination. (For example:- Students applying for examination in the year 2022, the examination will be on 2023, and completed age will be reckoned as on 31st March 2023.

- 5. Student should submit photocopy of mark list / certificate of previous examination if any along with the application form for admission to next level of examination.
- 6. Student should submit self attested photocopy of proof of age (Birth Certificate / SSLC Certificate) along with the application form for admission.
 - BSS Cultural Mission reserves its right to reject or accept any application if it is incomplete.

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- 8. Name of the student will be printed in the mark list exactly as per the name given at the time of admission. Any changes in the name should be intimated to the Controller of the Examinations or Co-ordinator in advance. Students should take care to mention their names correctly in the application forms (Admission, Registration and Examination).
- 9. A Student should attend for both practical and theory examinations separately. There will be examinations both in online and offline mode from this academic year onwards, as the situation demands.
- 10. For Swarapoorna- I Year Lower level-1 and Naatyapoorna-I Year -(fundamentals-Level-1), there will be written examination for theory Paper. Fee for internal examination should be remitted by the candidate at the time of examination.
- 11.. BSS Cultural Mission and The Programme Co-ordinating Centre reserve its right to increase or decrease the examination fee at any time and the decision shall be binding on all the students.
- 12. Examination results will be published through study centres and in the website of BSS. Cultural Mission.
- 13. The student who wishes to appear for Swarapoorna- Lower level-1, 2 Gaanapoorna- Higher level-1, 2 Examinations in Tabla he/she will have to play it in Hindustani style.
- 14. A student should get **50** % of marks in aggregate (for I Year & II Year of any course) in Theory and Practical *Separate* to be eligible for registration for next level course. ie. Gaanapoorna, Naatyapoorna specialisation and Kalaapoorna. However, for Raagapoorna and Naatyapoorna advanced, the marks will be **60**% in Theory and Practical *Separately*.
- 15. Hall tickets will reach the concerned Study Centres by Ist April of every year. Students have to keep in touch with concerned Centre in-charge to collect the hall tickets. If the candidate does not get the hall ticket by 15th April he/she has to contact the Controller of Examinations immediately.
- 16. For Naatyapoorna advanced examination will be conducted along with accompaniments (instruments and natuvangam). All the accompaniments and natuvangum artist will be provided by BSS Cultural Mission.
- 17. For Swarapoorna- Gaanapoorna & Raagapoorna (Music), Naatyapoorna-(Dance) and Chithrapoorna (Art) study materials / Notes- (Pdfs only) will be available. Students can write examination in Malayalam or English.
- 18. For Gaanapoorna & Raagapoorna (Music) Naatyapoorna Higher Naatyapoorna advanced (Dance) study materials of main portion only will be available. However details of reference books will be available from the concerned Study Centres.
- 19. Any student who fail to attain minimum pass mark in any examination he/she can attend a supplementary examination and get qualified for higher examination. Passed students can improve their mark by attending an improvement examination. These examinations will be conducted during September / October every year and examination venue will be decided by BSS Cultural Mission Programme Co-ordinating Centre.

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Examination Centres: All efforts will be made by BSS Cultural Mission to arrange examination centres in all districts of Kerala. This information will be conveyed to students at the time of issue of Hall Ticket.

Examination centre will be allotted only if there are at least *Twenty students for each subject*. If there are not enough students, examination centre for that subject will be combined with the nearest possible centre or Programme Co-ordinating centre.

BSS Cultural Mission reserves its right to change or cancel any examination centre for whatsoever reason and the decision shall be final and binding to all.

Study Centres: There will be institutions which are approved as study centres by BSS Cultural Mission from time to time. This information will be provided along with the application, in the prospectus and in the website.

DIRECT ADMISSION

Students may get admission directly to Gaanapoorna, Raagapoorna, Naatyapoorna-Higher, Naatyapoorna-Advanced & Chithrapoorna subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The student should appear for an **Entrance Test.**
- 2. He/she should secure a minimum of **60** % marks in theory and practical separately in the entrance examination for qualifying for direct admission. In the entrance examination for direct entry, a student will be allowed to appear for both practical and theory examinations. There will be theory examination for two or three hours and practical examination for one hour. BSS Cultural Mission reserves its right to accept/reject any application for **Direct Admission**.
- 3. The student has to apply for the entrance test through authorised Study centre. (Training Centre.)
- 4. An amount of Rs. 7,500/- (Indian money/Rupees) should be paid towards the *Admission & registration fee* for entrance examination of various courses of BSS Cultural Mission along with the application. Details of entrance *examination fee* can be had from the Programme Co-ordinating Centre or recognized study centres of BSS Cultural Mission.
- 5. Syllabus of previous year will be followed.
- 6. After passing the entrance examination the student can join the course of BSS Cultural Mission after remitting the normal course fee.
- 7. The student has to complete the stipulated age for the examination for which he/
